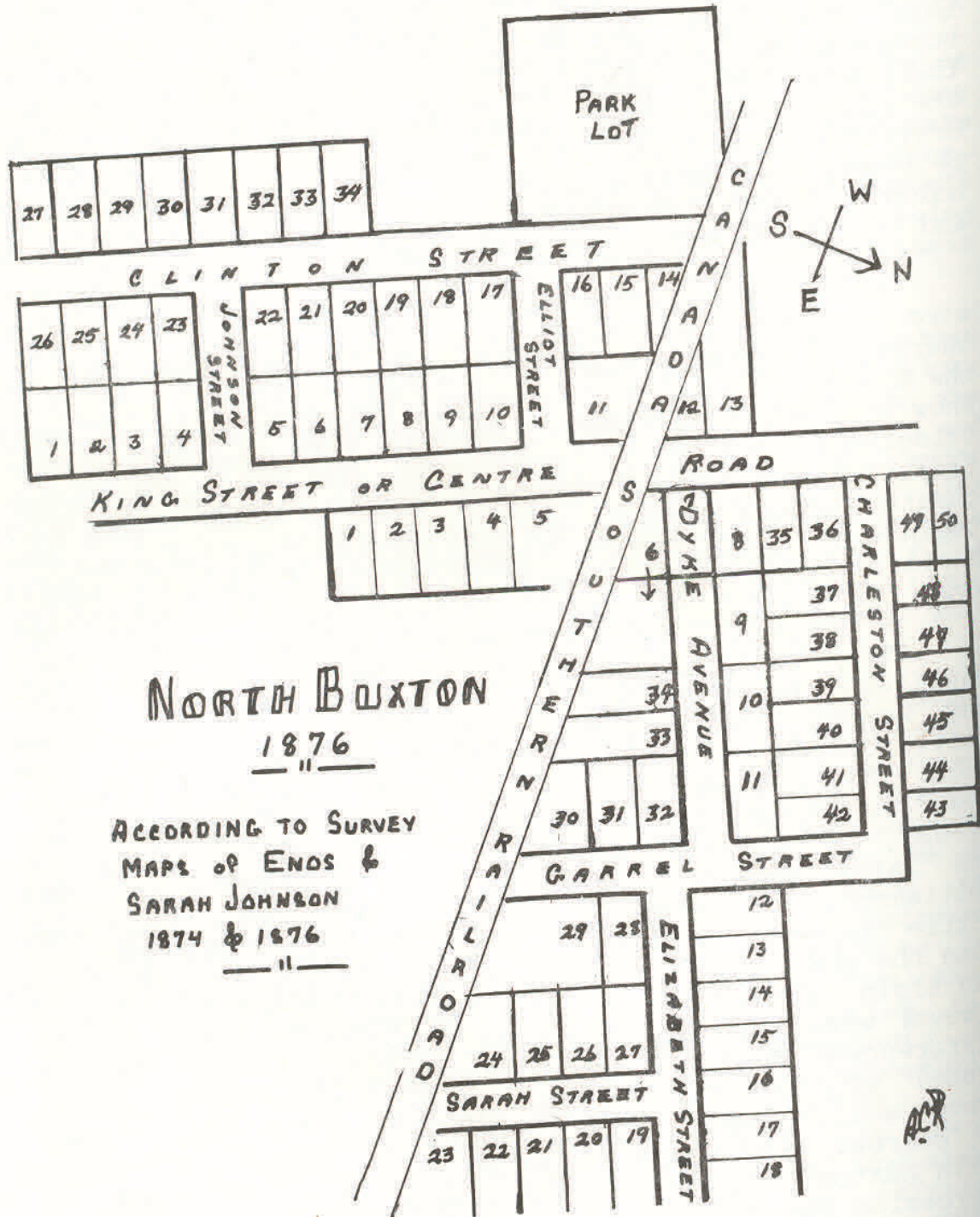

The Community That Hope Built

Using the lay out of the Map of Buxton 1876, draw a map of Buxton today. Use the following information and symbols.

1. Change the name of King Street or Centre Road to A.D. Shadd Road.
2. Place the Railroad as it is on the map of Buxton 1876, but name it the Canadian National Railroad.
3. Place houses on lots 28, 31, 26, and 25 Clinton Street.
4. Place 2 houses on lots 23 and 1 house on lot 22 Johnson Street.
5. Place a cemetery in the park lot on Clinton Street.
6. Place a church and a house on lot 17 Elliot Street.
7. Place a Woodworking shop on lot 10 Elliot Street and a Railway station on lot 10 facing on A.D. Shadd Road.
8. Place houses at lots 2,4,7,8,4 and 3 A. D Shadd Road.
9. Place a hall at lot 2 A.D. Shadd Road and a Church at Lot 1.
10. Place a lumber yard and woodworking shop at lot 5.
11. Place a cemetery beside lot 1 (South East) place a school next to it, then a park and museum.
12. Place a farm on lot 1 and 2 on A.D. Shadd Road.
13. Place several houses along Dyke and Charleston Streets.
14. Place a hall at lot 36 A.D. Shadd Road, and houses on lots 1, 8, 35, 49, and 50.
